For any of the projects in this guide, we facilitate:

- Local guidance and preparation to volunteers during all the process before, during & after the program.
- On arrival, transfer from the airport to the hostel or host family before the orientation day.
- Orientation day that is meant as guidance for a positive experience in the project, an introduction to Costa-rican history & culture, also a cultural city tour in the capital of Costa Rica.
- Good quality projects thanks to our long-term collaboration & close relationship with local partners.
- Support to participants during the entire program & emergency contact.
- Certificate of Participation.
- Accommodation and meals with a host family or project.

Breakfast at the hostel or any meals outside the time spent with the host family or the volunteer project. The meals included are those provided during the volunteering time and lunch on the orientation day

Accommodation or meals after the volunteering period (the hostel is only provided for the first nights, as volunteers usually make their own travel plans after completing the project).

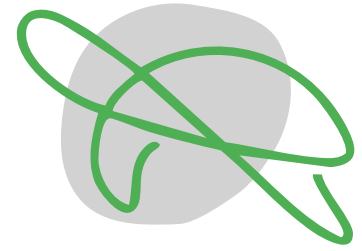


ECOLOGICAL PROJECTS



ACICRC01-20

TURTLE CONSERVATION IN SÁMARA, PACIFIC COAST



Goals:

The main goals include patrolling beaches at night, in the morning and caring for turtle nurseries. Volunteers build and supervise hatcheries, count release baby turtles and conduct exhumations after hatchings.

Assisting with collecting scientific data like examining turtle egg development, and share findings with biological institutions.

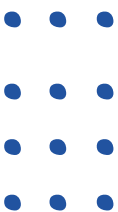
Additional responsibilities include maintaining infrastructure and cleaning beaches.

Tasks:

Tasks include: maintaining infrastructure, cleaning the beach, and transporting supplies from the river to the project site, 1-2 days per week.

Responsibilities also involve monitoring nesting activity, such as collecting and measuring eggs, marking females, and overseeing the hatchery.

Volunteers release baby turtles, collect nest data, and conduct exhumations. Daily night and morning patrols are scheduled based on turtle activity and tide times, along with three night shifts.

TURTLE CONSERVATION

IN MONTEZUMA, PACIFIC COAST



Goals:

Volunteers engage in a variety of activities, including patrolling the beach at night, building and supervising hatcheries, counting and releasing baby turtles.

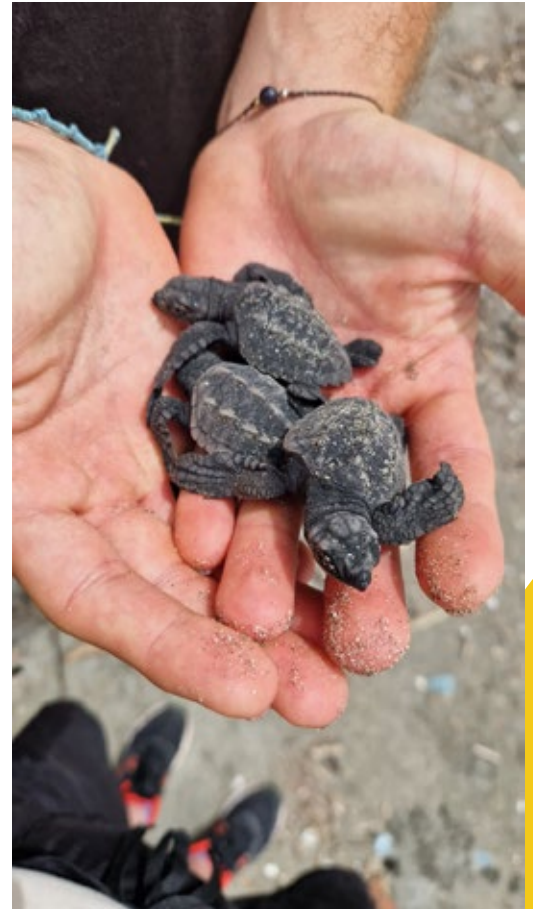
They also assist in collecting scientific data, maintaining infrastructure, and cleaning both the accommodation and the beach. Additional tasks include conducting exhumations and participating in community work.

Tasks:

Volunteers will work on various tasks, including: monitoring sea turtle nesting marking beaches, and constructing hatcheries for sea turtle conservation.

Responsibilities include night patrols to protect turtles and collect data, maintaining project infrastructure, repairing public trails, cleaning the beach and supporting environmental education and community protection activities.

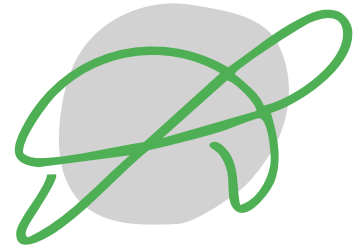
Volunteers also assist with community projects like school workshops, building community spaces and installing street signs.

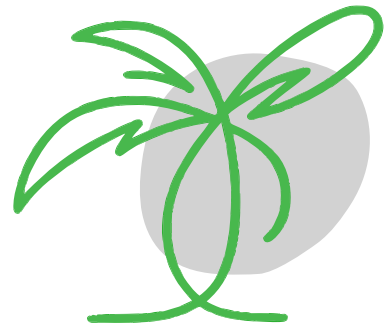

NATURAL RESERVE

IN THE CARIBBEAN COAST



Goals:

Volunteers collaborate with the national park to monitor and maintain the reservation. Tasks include day and night patrols, educating the public about sea turtles and how to assist them, collecting scientific data and maintaining infrastructure.

Volunteers also clean the beach and nearby town areas, participate in community projects, contribute to beach reforestation efforts.

Important:

This project does not work directly with turtles.

Tasks:

To protect the flora, fauna and nestling areas. Tasks include monitoring and maintaining the reservation, conducting day and night patrols with the national park and partner-organisations on boat/ATV rides in wildlife refuges.

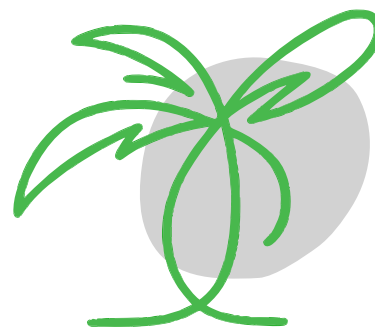
Educating tourists on proper interactions with hatchlings, repair public trails, maintain infrastructure, clean the beach and town areas and support the park's daily projects, collecting seeds for green projects, reforesting the beach to shield hatchlings, participating in environmental education and community events, such as school workshops and festivals.

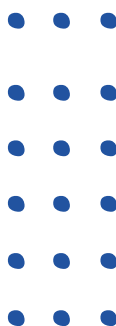

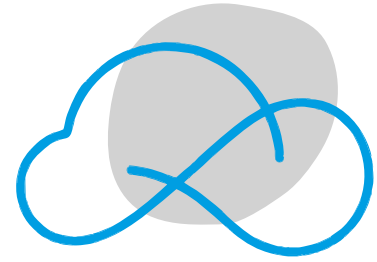

CLOUD FOREST RESERVE

IN MONTEVERDE



Goals:

The Santa Elena Cloud Forest Reserve in Monteverde combines conservation, eco-tourism, and education, benefiting the local community through its management by the Santa Elena Public High School.

Covering 310 hectares, it supports diverse species, provides water to nearby areas, and connects with other protected zones like the Children's Eternal Rainforest and Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve.

Tasks:

Volunteers help maintain and create trails, fix infrastructure, support the local high school's reforestation project, assist the main office with preservations and translations and provide support at the reception.

For longer stays, volunteers with specific skills may assist with research at the reserve. Those with photographic skills can contribute by creating materials for the park.

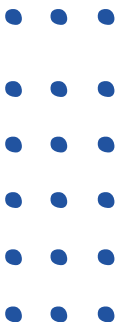

AGROECOLOGICAL FARM

IN PUNTARENAS



Goals:

The mission is to lead organic food production whilst preserving nature.

Focus on sustainable agriculture and food security, integrating conservation practices with innovative technology, trade and environmental protection through private enterprise.

Tasks:

Promoting sustainable agriculture, engaging in gardening, planting, composting and harvesting organic produce.

Key areas include a warehouse for storing grains and feed, a compost site for organic waste, a poultry, swine and fish farming.

Tasks range from construction and animal care cleaning and caring.

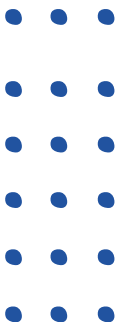

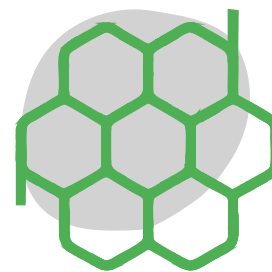

WATER SHED CONSERVATION

Goals:

To promote environmental education, ecological restoration, sustainable employment and fire prevention in collaboration with schools, community members and educational tours.

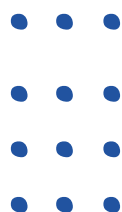
To combat droughts, there is focus on planting trees and the water conservation. Supporting local employment by producing and selling honey using sustainable practices.

Tasks:

Volunteers assist with tree planting, irrigation, plant/treecare, orchard maintenance and seed collection.

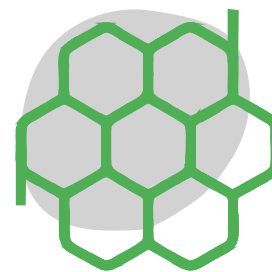
Tasks also include to help in the nursery and contribute to the maintenance of the projects infrastructure, including building facilities and general cleaning.

Additionally, volunteers will support the production of honey containers.

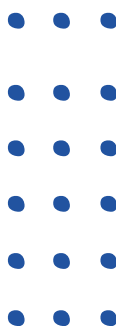

BUTTERFLY GARDEN

IN SAN JOSÉ



Goals:

The project strives to be a model of eco-sustainable development through the reproduction of butterflies.

By hosting school groups, they demonstrate how natural resources can be used sustainably with minimal environmental impact.

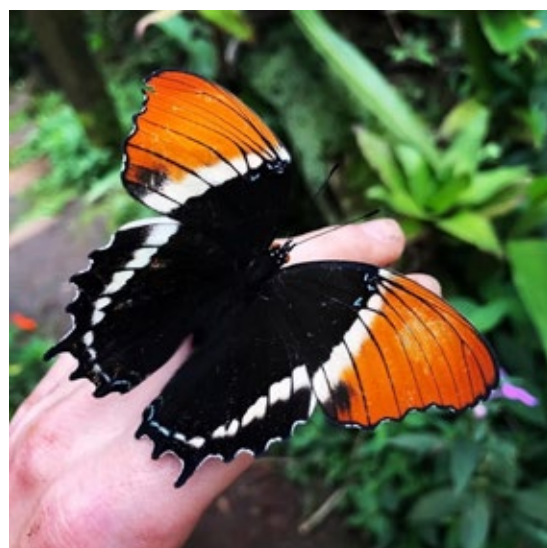
They are dedicated to reproduction, conservation and export of Costa Rican butterfly species whilst promoting environmental education for visitors and educational institutions.

Tasks:

Volunteers do various tasks. In the laboratory, they feed, clean, organise materials and collect data on hatching, pupae and eggs.

In the garden they weed, pruning, compost, maintain feeders, care for land turtle and orchids.

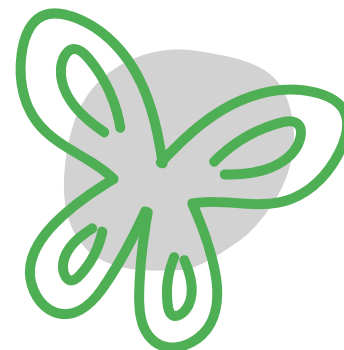
Volunteers may assist as guides, educating visitors about butterflies and lead trail tours. They also support administrative tasks like the reception, distributing materials, online marketing, translate documents and obtain promotional videos and photos.

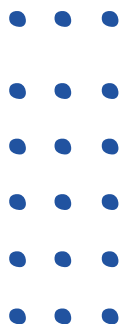

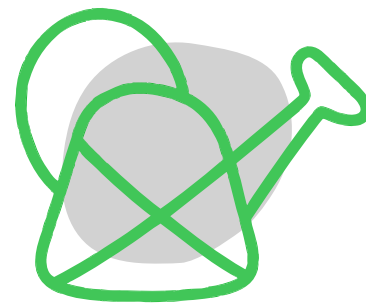

AGROECOLOGICAL FARM

IN CARTAGO



Goals:

Finca La Flor is conceived as a project that integrates three interconnected areas: agricultural and regenerative practices, environmental education, and culture and well-being. Currently, the project is in a phase of reactivation, gradually resuming and strengthening its activities.

Tasks:

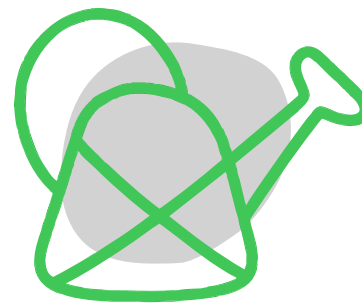

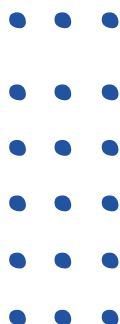
